


# WE COULDN'T DO IT WITHOUT OUR FUNDRAISING HEROES!

# SHARON'S JOURNEY TO BECOME A RGN AT CRANSLEY

We caught up with Sharon Butlin to take a look back at her journey and experience and how she got to be a specialist palliative care nurse here at Cransley Hospice:

"After leaving school at 16, I started work in a hairdresser's and to earn some extra money I worked at a local care home at weekends. I soon realised I wanted to work in care full-time, which I did for quite a few years. I liked my job and continued working part time when I had my children, but when they both started full time school I realised I wanted a bit more from my work and registered for an access course at Tresham.

This gave me the stepping stone to a 3-year Adult Nursing Diploma course at the University of Northampton. It wasn't easy; being a mature student, studying, working and looking after 2 little kids. Finishing an assignment at 3.00am in the morning isn't ideal, but you manage, and juggle life, if the cleaning doesn't get done for a bit, it's fine. I was determined!

After qualifying I worked at KGH on the Naseby ward, before moving to Intensive Care. I did lots of courses, including working with the palliative care patients and when my dad was diagnosed with Cancer, my family and I nursed him at home and this helped me decide that this was really where my heart needed to be.

When I recently saw the position come up at Cransley I didn't hesitate and just went for it. I have only been here a few weeks, but I love it! I love coming to work, everyone at the hospice is so welcoming.

If I could give anyone any advice about coming into the profession, at any age, I would say, don't let anyone tell you you can't do it. It's so rewarding and a privilege to be here."

# HISTORY OF CRANSLEY HOSPICE - PART 1

Hospices are often developed after years of planning and fundraising but not in Cransley's case. Overnight would be an exaggeration but only just. When I was appointed Consultant in Palliative Medicine in 1995 the county had only one hospice, Cynthia Spencer in Northampton. It soon became apparent that patients from this end of the county with serious and complex problems at the end of their lives had little chance of being admitted there. Whilst walking through St. Mary's Hospital with Linda Morrison, a Macmillan nurse, we spotted 2 half empty long stay wards; Cransley and Pytchley, strangely homely with wallpaper on the walls and flowered duvets on the beds. "That would make a nice hospice ward" we said aloud pointing to Cransley.



Within a week the ward sister was on the phone saying I could have 4 beds. It was wonderfully crazy, and a week later I admitted a patient and soon I was filling the ward. The nursing staff adapted and were magnificent, as they are today, because it is skilled care that matters and always will. And yet, Cransley was a strange little ward. There wasn't even a proper bathroom and the armchairs would have looked better on a skip! Within a year £100,000 was raised over a weekend to modernise and convert the ward, and Cransley became what it was in all but name. No planning, no massive fundraising appeals and no years of anticipation, but that is what we need to do now as we must move from our present building - the successor to that old and lovely Cransley ward but more of that next time.
